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Subject: Proposal Planning Technical Meetings Components

Hereby we would like to reach out about the follow-up process after our meeting next week Tuesday. We already would like to explore the possibility to engage in technical discussions on the level of the components of the documents that we have shared thus far, in order to get more clarity on the potential qualification of measures for a Dutch draft RRP and to receive your guidance on what additional information would be needed from your side for each individual measure.

Therefore, we would like to explore the possibility to set up separate meetings for the following components in the week between the 15th and the 19th of March. As we are aware that time is scarce, we are flexible in the amount of time that you can dedicate to each component (we were thinking 1,5 hours for each component) and the order of the components to be discussed:

- Component 1: health
- COLOCIC Component 2: labour market and education
- COMPONENT 3: boosting private and public investments
- Component 4: the green transition
- CONTRACT Component 5: the digital transition
- Component 6: pensions and housing
- CONTRACT Component 7: fighting aggressive fiscal planning and money laundering

Furthermore, as you know we have been given the political mandate to identify measures that can fulfill the RRF criteria. Thus, in addition to the initial measures that are already being assessed through the working document, we are also identifying new proposals that we believe to be largely in line with the RRF-criteria. We would like to discuss these new proposals on each of the above-mentioned components with you in the weeks before the 9^{th} of April. Please be aware that we can share the new proposals in writing with you from the 25^{th} of March onwards. We can also discuss the measures then again that we have already covered in the series of meetings in the week of 15 - 19 March. The proposals that are most likely to be eligible for a Dutch RRP will be part of a package that will be presented towards the political parties during the next cabinet formation.

In the meantime, we already would like to share three new proposals on digitalization (please see attached), which are part of a broader assessment and are still in a preliminary phase (for example, still in Dutch). We are however keen to hear your first (written) feedback on these specific proposals. Later in the process we can discuss these items together with the other new proposals in the second round of technical meetings.

Lastly, please find attached some questions that came up on our side while drafting the document that we have already shared with you. We intend to discuss these with you during our meeting next Tuesday.
