I think I already shared with you my personal and professional appreciation for the innovative, interesting, important and insightful approach. We've never seen such an open and time-boxed challenge at this scale. It will certainly generate new insights and I will be happy to apply the methodology of the Institute of Brilliant Failures to reveal these and with the positive framing we are known for, deliver a value case for learning and further work in this area.

The reason I write to you (in English), however, is because of the recent request for support that recently was issued by the Ministry of Health, Wellbeing and Sports to build a knowledge base for AI applications in relation to COVID-19.
