

The project was approved by the Ministry of Public Affairs (PaG/BJZ/49986) and the Ethics Committee for Legal and Criminological Research (CERCO) at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam.

The longer response is included in the attached document on privacy CCTV that I used for my rebuttal when I got the same question for a recent ZonMW proposal I submitted (and received funding for under the file number 50-56300-98-

I also attached the final approval letter from the ethical commission approving the face mask study (that involved CCTV and street interviews). My permission from OM was originally for CCTV footage of robberies and conflicts in public (see attachment). It was extended to include "Covid-19 related conflicts in public" in an email correspondence (that I will forward now just in case).







I have a few minor points that maybe you could address. I also think it would be useful if after processing those, we als our virology colleagues whether they have additional questions. To ensure the results are as relevant as possible.

## Minor points:

- perhaps skip conclusions such as 'this is different than previously suspected' of this is not supported by an authoritative paper or policy document.
- some percentages can now be read as eg 11% of the people, whereas this also includes a time window in the coding (eg 30s). Probably good to include
- when possible, please include an absolute effect size incl 95%ci such as for the differences in risky face touching. Helps to evaluate degree of relevance
- when looking at distance, a key point has been in policy making this fake sense of security. I would mention that as well as that there are some studies suggesting distance increases (in an more experimental design). The study that may be most relevant to compare with this study is the Italian study om the side walks (rather than in cues?), which observed a quite large effect that we are clearly not seeing here.

We've just updated a literature review on these behavioural effects of face masks on our website, perhaps also check that document for useful references and potential limitations of this study and others. Would be useful to have the results being placed in the context of that literature if possible (perhaps a single paragraph on how this study relates to the larger evidence base?).
