In response to your questions I would like to mention and answer the following:

- When traveling over land to the Netherlands through Germany and Austria there is no need to self quarantine for two weeks in the Netherlands. We advise to adhere to Dutch measures to work from home when possible, stay inside at home as much as possible, keep 1,5 meters distance from other people and monitor health. When COVID complaints develop then the advise is to stay inside till 24 hours after symptoms resolve.
- There is no closure of the Dutch borders. The situation on other country borders is not known. There is a general advise in Europe and the Netherlands not to travel when it is not necessary.

In conclusion we can inform you that there should be no problem for your friend to travel to the Netherlands. No quarantine is needed, but we like to strictly advise to adhere to Dutch measures after arrival. How the situation is on the German and Austrian borders at the moment is not known and subject to change.

I hope this information will help your friend with her travel plans.

Thank you for your question about the possible restrictions and other mandatory measures related to COVID-19 entering the Netherlands.

If you enter the Netherlands and come from a region where there is a high rate of coronavirusinfections the Dutch government urges you to take measures to prevent spreading coronavirus when you arrive at your destination/home in the Netherlands.

Immediately after reaching your destination in the Netherlands you have to self-quarantine for 14 days. In [this](#) letter you can find more information about self-quarantine.
