(10)(2e) provided a very nice overview for the situation in Mongolia. Wouldn't it be great to have similar overviews from Bolivia, Georgia, Pakistan, Germany, etc. If you have a summary of Coronavirus, please send this to (10)(2e) for posting ((10)(2e)@gmail.com). This will highlight your efforts as well as your country's efforts. Also, it will be extremely important to see what other CCs and countries are doing with Coronavirus. Wouldn't it be great if we knew what other WHO CC and countries are doing with COVID-19, what works and what does not work. We would post your Covid-19 overview as we have with (10)(2e) excellent overview:

Dear (10)(2e) (10)(2e),

As a director of WHO CC MOG-1 in Mongolia, I would like to express me interest in collaborating the Covid-19 Epidemiologic paper.

As a start, I would like to inform you about Covid-19 situation on Mongolia, right now:

There are 140 patients diagnosed with Covid-19.  
 -26 treated and out of hospital  
 -114 still at the hospital .

All 140 patients were transported via Charter flight from other foreign countries (mostly from Russia).  
 There are no reported Covid-19 transfer inside Mongolia.

- Mongolia has adopted the following preventative measures against COVID-19:
- As of March 10, all foreigners will be denied entry into Mongolia
- Closure of city administration cultural offices, e.g. libraries, museums, and community and cultural centers
- Closure of schools, universities, cinemas and entertainment centers until September 1.
- Professional and short-term training centers will be gradually opened. These include vocational trainings, language centers, and driving schools.
- School age children are prohibited from appearing in public places (10)(2e)
- Prohibition of public gatherings
- Starting May 1, gyms, swimming pools, tourist camps, leisure centers, hotels, and similar public locations were opened if they meet standards of disinfection and implement social distancing.
- Religious institutions are only allowed to conduct internal activities.
- Bars and karaoke centers are closed for indefinite period and restaurants will operate until 10:00PM.
- The sale of alcoholic beverages is allowed only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- Visitors to public offices are subject to temperature screenings and required to wear a facemask.
- All flights to/from foreign locations have been suspended
