During the Corona crisis, critical bottlenecks emerged in European health care systems, ranging from personal protective equipment over testing capacities to specialised intensive-care technologies. However, food and other integrated supply chains were also endangered by border closures and restrictions on the mobility of (seasonal) workers. The EU's response to the Corona crisis, for all its alleged shortcomings, has therefore been explicitly cross-sectoral from the outset.

From a trade and investment perspective, the wish for a stable domestic supply chain can clash with the need for sustainable international value chains (and with international solidarity). Globally, increasing protectionism on critical goods and services can be observed recently. A "build back better"-approach calls for more sustainable rules for growing trade again after the lockdowns.

Since 2016 (Bratislava agenda) already, European leaders have been calling for a "Union that protects" in order to meet salient demands of citizens (migration, terrorism). More recently, policy-makers also turned to more hidden risks. Among others, initiatives to counter hybrid threats or to improve the European programme on critical infrastructure protection have been placed on the agenda. Last but not least, the European recovery and resilience facility and new proposals for an upgraded EU civil protection mechanism have been presented.

Hence, the upcoming German Council Presidency will shape the Union's role as a security provider. We need to debate more on how EU resilience (or strategic autonomy) can be promoted from an all-hazards perspective. How should the EU relate to the rapidly changing security dimension of trade, critical infrastructures and supply chains? What are realistic avenues for reform? How do European initiatives match with national security concepts and experiences?

To explore these questions, this closed event brings together different communities that deal with trade, crisis management and civil protection.
