Question 1: What are the testing options/resources in islands? For example, in Samos when we are reporting 0 cases were there any tests performed?

Testing in the Greek islands is conducted by the Mobile Health Units of the National Public Health Organization which operate locally or in nearby smaller islands. Testing can also be conducted in regional Health Centers and Hospitals in larger islands. The daily testing capacity for all islands never drops below 200 per day and can be significantly increased (>1000 per day) if needed. In Samos island, we report 4 confirmed cases and 487 tests conducted (RT-PCR). Samos airport POE screening (see table for POEs) reports 0 positives and 14 tests conducted.
