All of our clinicians are COVID PCR tested prior to being sent to St. Maarten (or any island for that matter). It was asked of us by the island that they do additional COVID-19 tests once we got there, but we do provide proof of valid PCR tests within 72 hours of our clinicians arriving. We were informed last week that the island would like to stop providing secondary testing to our clinicians because we already do testing. This is not an issue.

As for MRSA - we are actively working on this with the island. We are happy to source MRSA testing in the US. Prior to this St. Maarten had informed us they were happy to do this test on the island. But if this has become in any way burdensome we will do the same as we do with Curacao and get these tests in Miami.

A few issues after a VC we had with SMMC:

- AMI staff for CPS and ambulances come to the hospital for Covid testing. In our understanding AMI brings its own on site test, since the contract mentions this. Can you explain why your staff comes to the hospital for tests and do you agree with us that this should be done with the AMI tests? Since there is a problem with testing capacity on Sint Maarten this becomes an issue for SMMC.
- SMMC informed us that you don't follow MRSA protocols with new staff. With the first teams it was accepted since it was a crisis situation. We assume that after working with Aruba and Curacao AMI understands that MRSA spread prevention is very important in Dutch hospitals. Can you work in the same way with SMMC, since it is a burden when SMMC has MRSA positive AMI staff.
