The Netherlands does not require a (negative) test certificate to enter the country. However, travellers from countries for which an orange/red travel advisory is in place because of the spread of the coronavirus are strongly advised to self-quarantine for 10 days upon arrival in the Netherlands. Testing facilities have been set up at Amsterdam Schiphol airport for travellers from these countries. However, a negative test result cannot lift the 10-day quarantine measure.
