Sorry for my delayed response. Your email arrived the day my summer vacation started ☺

Yes, we have some experience with the use of saliva for COVID19 PCR testing in kids, although I was not personally involved in the lab work. I can bring you into contact with our virologist at the national institute of public health who is working on this. They are currently investigating whether 5.1.2e could be used as alternative for NPH in routine diagnostics for kids and we plan to use it in another study on kids and SARS-CoV-2 household transmission this fall.

I read on twitter that your own household expanded recently ☺, congratulations!
