RE question 1.

Yes, we can use the AstraZeneca vaccine in those 60-70 year olds. In the UK they use all vaccines in all 18+, so this is possible. However to which extend is this question about delay and trade-off between vaccines? Should we read this question as, should we rather delay vaccinating the 60-70 year old by waiting for Pfizer/Moderna compared to immediately vaccinating them with AstraZeneca? And when we wait, do we start vaccinating the 50-60 in the meantime? But when AstraZeneca will be available those 70+ won't be all vaccinated yet, so it implies that some 70+ will have to wait anyway?
