Update: Since the previous RT report published on 7 March 2020 and as of 8 March 2020, 3 696 new cases of COVID-19 (in accordance with the applied case definitions in the affected countries) and 96 new deaths have been reported. Five countries have reported cases for the first time: Bulgaria, Maldives, Malta, Moldova, and Paraguay.

New cases have been reported from Italy (1 247), Iran (1 076), South Korea (367), Germany (163), France (103), United States (95), Belgium (60), Netherlands (60), Spain (56), Switzerland (55), Japan (47), China (46), United Kingdom (43), Norway (34), Austria (30), Sweden (24), Greece (21), Iraq (16), United Arab Emirates (16), Australia (11), Malaysia (10), Iceland (10), Singapore (8), Denmark (8), Portugal (8), Bahrain (7), Czech Republic (7), Canada (6), Israel (6), Romania (6), Vietnam (4), Afghanistan (3), India (3), Kuwait (3), Palestine* (3), Georgia (3), Hungary (3), Malta (3), San Marino (3), Slovenia (3), Maldives (2), Saudi Arabia (2), Bulgaria (2), Slovakia (2), South Africa (1), Argentina (1), Paraguay (1), Cambodia (1), Philippines (1), Qatar (1), Croatia (1), Ireland (1), Latvia (1), Moldova (1) and Poland (1).

New deaths have been reported from Italy (36), China (27), Iran (21), South Korea (6), United States (3), Argentina (1), France (1), United Kingdom (1) and Australia (1).

Major developments in the EU/EEA and the UK:

Italy: <u>Italy</u> reported 5 833 cases of COVID-19 and 233 deaths. This is an increase of 1 247 cases and 36 deaths since yesterday. According to <u>media</u>, the Italian government announced to quarantine Lombardy region and 14 additional provinces until 3 April.

Germany: Germany reported 847 cases of COVID-19 and no deaths. This is an increase of 163 cases since yesterday.

France: France reported 713 cases of COVID-19 and ten deaths. This is an increase of 100 cases and one death since yesterday.

Spain: Spanish authorities reported 430 cases of COVID-19 and five deaths. This is an increase of 56 cases since yesterday.

United Kingdom: The UK reported 206 cases of COVID-19 and two deaths through EWRS. This is an increase of 43 cases and one death since yesterday.

Bulgaria: Authorities reported the first two cases of COVID-19.

Malta: Malta reported the first three cases of COVID-19 through EWRS. According to media the first case has travel history to Italy. The other two cases are family members.

Other updates:

Argentina: Argentinian authorities reported one additional case of COVID-19 and the first death.

Egypt: In addition to the 17 cases reported by the authorities, media are reporting 33 cases on a Nile cruise ship.

Maldives: The Ministry of Health reported the first two cases of COVID-19.

Moldova: Authorities reported the first case of COVID-19.

Paraguay: Paraguayan authorities reported the first case of COVID-19.

Argentina: Argentinian authorities reported one additional case of COVID-19 and the first death.

Summary: Since 31 December 2019 and as of 8 March 2020, 105 828 cases of COVID-19 (in accordance with the applied case definitions in the affected countries) have been reported, including 3 584 deaths. The deaths have been reported from China (3 099), Italy (233), Iran (145), South Korea (50), United States Of America (17), France (10), International conveyance in Japan (6), Japan (6), Spain (5), Australia (3), Iraq (2), United Kingdom (2), Argentina (1), Netherlands (1), San Marino (1), Switzerland (1), Taiwan (1) and Thailand (1).


