Thanks again for sending this information over. It would be really useful if you are able to provide details around the following questions. If it is easier to discuss this, we'd be very happy to have a call with whenever is convenient for you.

- Is the maximum volume of blood that you can collect with these kits 300ul?
- How many samples that you have collected so far have contained 300ul whole blood?
- What is the average volume of whole blood you receive?
- How many samples you receive do not contain sufficient volume to make fractionation viable?
- Are you receiving the samples in your lab and fractionating them?
 - If so, would you be happy to share the SOP for this process (e.g. including equipment, timings, etc.)?
- What volume of plasma are you obtaining from the samples?
