Subject: Draft Implementing Regulation making the exportation of certain

products subject to the production of an export authorisation -

outcome written procedure

Dear Members of the Committee,

Thank you very much for the opinion you sent to us in connection with the above mentioned draft implementing Regulation.

I would like to inform you that the Committee delivered a positive opinion. The 26¹ Member States being in favour of the Draft Implementing Regulation represent 98,44 % of the EU population. The voting sheet is attached to this note. In addition, you will also find in annex a declaration made by one Member State.

During the consultation, we have received requests for clarification regarding the product scope and procedural aspects related to deadlines, exclusions of some types of transactions and the role of the Clearing house. After analysing these carefully, we have clarified these elements in the attached document, which will be incorporated in the FAQs currently available on our website.

Declaration made by Sweden

Sweden regrets the new proposal as we were foreseeing a more limited scope. Sweden would have preferred no restrictions at all. Sweden would like to emphasize again that it is crucial that all Member States immediately lift their remaining national restrictions. The free circulation of goods within the Union is one of the core principles of the EU and has to be respected. Furthermore, it is crucial to ensure efficiency as regards trade and distribution of necessary medical equipment also during this crisis. We must strive to keep markets open with our trading partners and prevent an escalation of trade barriers. The global value chains typical to specialised medical equipment must be safeguarded. The effects on developing countries must be monitored.
