I am not sure if the letter the Commission has issued to the EU trade associations, following this week's EU Ex SG, has come to your attention. My point relates specifically to the annex and I would be grateful for your thoughts.

We have received a number of very angry phone calls from companies based in Ireland that are not happy with their products being identifiable through this and are concerned about reputation. I am also not sure why the information on shortage status has been given, and perhaps this could have been managed as a more generic annex to identify those medicines considered critical and where increased capacity is needed and in this priority (taking into account those known already to be short).

I would be concerned that this will get into the media and there will be panic at MS level, it will cause stock piling and demand buying - all the things we have tried to prevent.
