Hope this email finds you in good health!

At Colombia we are already battling Covid 19, even though until now we have around 1000 people diagnosed and "only" 16 deaths in all our country; it is still yet a low incidence and our country has already (since 15 days ago) taken very strict policies and we are all in quarantine working from our homes, but we will have to see how we will continue through this tough days.

I hope you all are taking care of yourself and that your families are as well doing fine.

As for the medical needs of teams at the islands, I will check with our main allies if this is an option, if they do have doctors and nurses available for this need and I will get back to you with an answer.

As for the medical supplies, on Thursday April 2nd or Friday I am waiting for the long sleeved gowns that were planned to send to the islands, I hope to receive them and be able to ship them on an air ambulance or if the charter will be flying back to Bonaire.

Glasses and masks (ffp1 and N95) were already sent to Bonaire. The only thing that has been almost impossible to find are the XL gloves, I am still waiting for the providers answer as they are trying to find them.

I hope you and yours are well. The Netherlands have been in the top countries of the European infection. One of the reasons for this was that a holiday when people go skiing in Northern Italy coincided with Carnival. So ICU and isolation capacity here is a problem at the moment. Blessedly the Caribbean islands are a few weeks behind, but infections in Aruba, Curacao and Sint Maarten have already occurred.

We don't hear much about the situation in Colombia, but I imagine you are either preparing or already in full swing battling this pandemic. We are thinking of you too and wish you all the best.

We are very glad that the government of Colombia decided to open the border for the super-specialised non-Covid19 patients (trauma, obstetric/neonatology and oncology).

As you know, the islands do not have a very robust health care system and have a low ICU-beds vs population ratio. We are working hard to get ventilators and other ICU equipment (monitoring, injection-pumps etc) to the islands, but of course these goods are scarce worldwide. Do you think it would be possible to arrange:

- ICU teams (doctors and nurses) to come and help out at the different islands (Sint Maarten, Bonaire, Curacao)
- respiratory/general nurses for isolation wards
- personal protective equipment (long sleeved gowns, gloves, glasses, masks (ffp1 and ffp2/N95))

I hope Colombia/Coomeva can assist us in this as well, although we realize we are asking for scarce goods.
