Toegang tot medische zorg maar ook de maatschappelijke ondersteuning, jeugdhulp en publieke gezondheid horen daarbij. In de vaccinatiestrategie COVID-19 worden zij 'gewoon' meegenomen, maar ook waar het bevolkingsonderzoeken en/of de JGZ betreft.

We voeren bij mijn weten geen apart beleid om de gezondheidsverschillen voor deze specifieke groep te verkleinen of apart beleid te voeren hoe hen te benaderen. We hope this finds you well!

We would like to invite you to the **next virtual meeting of the Integration Futures Working Group**, which will take place in late May 2021. With Europe in the midst of a complicated vaccine rollout, the meeting will have an extremely topical focus: it will look at **the role of public health in promoting immigrant integration, during and after COVID-19**. We would kindly ask you to let us know as soon as possible whether you would be available to participate on either 26 May or 1 June, from 15.00-17.00 CEST, so that we can save the date.

This meeting will bring together national government officials and experts in public health and service planning to discuss the links between healthcare and immigrant integration, and what the dramatic experience of COVID-19 tells us on how to address these policy priorities in concert. Health promotion is key to ensure that all community members can participate in education, employment, and society, thus contributing to social welfare and cohesion. Yet migrants, refugees and minorities have long experienced challenges to accessing health services, from legal hurdles to linguistic and intercultural barriers; and the pandemic has further exacerbated this 'migrant health gap'. With COVID-19 likely to radically reshape healthcare systems in Europe and worldwide, policymakers will have to make sure that these structural changes accommodate the complex needs of diverse populations—with important lessons to be learned for public service planning as a whole.

This meeting will consider a diverse set of questions relevant for integration policymakers:

- **Understanding the migrant health gap.** What health disparities do migrants and refugees face in diverse European societies, and how has COVID-19 accentuated these disparities? How are the root causes for the 'migrant health gap' related to structural inequalities and migrant integration? What are the barriers to accessing health services—e. g. language barriers and lack of adequate coverage, but also obstacles deriving from how healthcare services are designed, funded, and linked to other services? What groups of migrants and refugees are especially exposed to (physical and mental) health risks, and how does this affect integration trajectories?
- **A 'health check' for integration policy.** What do we know about how health interacts with other dimensions of integration policy—such as education, employment, housing, and social participation? How can governments leverage these links, by

mainstreaming health promotion considerations across integration investments? What concrete models and practices can provide lessons in this regard? And what is the real potential of these strategies to maximise integration outcomes while reducing service pressures and public costs?

- **Inclusive public health after the pandemic.** What have been the main innovations during COVID-19 to protect the health of (vulnerable) migrants and refugees and other hard-to-reach populations—from outreach strategies to regularisations? Which ones have proven most effective? How may COVID-19 revolutionise healthcare services in the longer term (for example in terms of digital service provision, skills recruitment/development, and financial models) and what are the opportunities and risks of these transformations to advance inclusion? How can the current rethinking of strategies/services in public health inspire change in other public services that are key to promoting integration?

We would be very grateful if you could let us know by the end of this week whether you will be able to participate, and what date would suit you best.
