I just got word from 5.1.2e. After discussion internally, it has been decided that all the AMI staff currently working on the island will be vaccinated. They will therefore join the vaccination rounds on the islands. However, we do have two conditions before we proceed to this.

- There are 3 weeks between two vaccinations. Staff who are vaccinated must stay on the island for at least a period of 3 months to work, starting from the first vaccination.
- from 8 March 2021, all ami personnel coming to the island must be vaccinated.

We want this to happen fairly quickly because the hospitals would like to start vaccinating the staff as soon as possible. So we would like an agreement from you today on the terms that the staff can actually stay for 3 months from now on. If you agree, this will be communicated directly to the hospitals.
