Austria	<p>..not stopped vaccination, so continues vaccination with AZ.</p> <p>We have put 1 batch on-hold (ABV5300), but due to the statement in the EMA Press release " there is no evidence of a problem related to specific batches of the vaccine or to particular manufacturing sites;" we will also lift the block on this batch. We will inform the EU network accordingly.</p>

Estonia	<p>didn't stop the vaccination with AZ, so going on with it now. Yesterday it was decided to use the AZ vaccine mainly for persons over 60 years till further information will be available. Finland	today our national expert group on vaccination recommend that AZ vaccine should give only above 65 years old. After that our responsible organization of vaccination program plan/ will pause the AZ vaccination for a while.

Germany	Germany will continue to vaccinate with AstraZeneca, but only in conjunction with a specific information for each person willing to get vaccinated with the COVID-19 vaccine AstraZeneca and an information to medical doctors to closely look for signal and/or symptoms of thrombosis in persons who present themselves with the known symptoms within about 2 weeks after AstraZeneca vaccination. It is thus assured that suitable therapeutic interventions can be taken to avoid additional cases of severe cerebral thromboses
Greece	Greece has never stopped vaccination with AZ covid-vaccine. We strongly support the PRAC and EMA approach and suggestions.
Hungary	Has not halted AZ vaccination and is not planning this, either. Will continue to administer AZ in the future.

Italy	Italy is waiting for the CHMP adoption, then AIFA will revoke the ban of use. The government declared that the AZ vaccination campaign will restart just after. No limitations are foreseen, the vaccination with AZ vaccination continues with priority to workers (school staff, police personnel and selected work categories).

Luxembourg	Luxembourg has resumed vaccinations as of today.

Poland	Poland has never suspended vaccination with the AZ vaccine. We supported the EMA position elaborated by PRAC from the very beginning. We continue to vaccinate according to the national immunization plan, bearing in mind the fact that each break brings higher risks to society.
Portugal	will resume AZ vaccination as from next Monday.
Romania	In Romania the vaccination with COVID19 vaccine AZ has not been stopped, only one batch was put on hold (ABV2856). Th intention is to lift the restriction on the use of this batch. The decision will be taken today, after the meeting of the National Committee on COVID19 Vaccination Coordination Activities. The PRAC recommendation will be considered.
Slovakia	In Slovakia we didn't pause vaccination with AZ and for now we continue without any restriction. Education of patients and physicians will be done immediately.
Slovenia	will restart vaccination with AZ vaccine after a pause, when majority of MS decided to put vaccination on-hold.
Spain	Spain will resume the AZ vaccination next week. The decision to resume the vaccination was made yesterday but the vaccination committee, with the advice of experts, will decide during the weekend how to resume the vaccination.

in Liechtenstein we orientate on Switzerland regarding the vaccines. As the vaccine from AstraZeneca is not yet approved in Switzerland, we do not vaccinate with this vaccine yet.
The Norwegian Institute of Public Health have decided to continue the pausing of AZ vaccination for the original 14 days.
Our public health agency (Folkhelsemyndigheten) halted the AZ vaccinations on the 16th of March and have announced that the pause continues (examination of the results from PRACs findings and discussions with our agency are ongoing). A new decision is likely to come next week according to a press conference yesterday
