



You are invited to receive a COVID vaccination. You will receive this vaccination at the GZA-location of the asylum seekers centre.

If you need help you can ask COA or GZA to help you.

1. The following is important:

- The vaccination is for free.
- The vaccination is voluntary.
- A vaccination prevents you from getting ill from the coronavirus. If you have been vaccinated, you are very unlikely to get the coronavirus after all.
- If you do not want to receive the vaccination, please tell GZA as soon as possible.
- You will receive the Moderna, which has been approved by the European Medicines Agency.
- You receive 2 vaccinations, about 4 weeks apart.

2. When you go to GZA for your vaccination:

- You need to take your "Oproepkaart" with you. This is included in this invitation.
- You need to wear a mouth mask and keep 1,5 meter distance.
- You need to take your ID-card or Zorgpas.
- You need to choose whether GZA can share your information with the RIVM (National institute for public health)
- If you do not share this information you will still get the vaccination.
- The doctor or nurse will ask some questions about your health.

3. You can not come if:

- You tested positive on COVID in the last 4 weeks.
- You have a fever of 38 Celsius or higher.
- You have COVID-symptoms like: a nasal cold, runny nose, sneezing, coughing, shortness of breath, sudden loss of taste and smell.
- You are in quarantine.
- You are receiving another vaccination against a different illness in the week before or after the COVID vaccination.

If you are not able to come, please call your local GZA to tell us as soon as possible.
