I hereby send my edits. I accepted most of yours. Updating the manuscript to the most recent data would require a thorough re-write to incorporate policy changes and further discussion. I suggest keeping the study period until the end of October. It might be of interest to later follow this article up with an update after our new lockdown, which started today.
I have added the supplementary table with the totals per category. I will send an overall subplot for the Figure within the next 30 minutes.
You also suggested to add an epicurve after the introduction. I have copied in a screenshot of an epicurve of hospitalisations, because during the first wave we did not have mass testing. But I would need to ask permission to publish these data, from the owners. If obtained, I will edit this curve, with English axes, weeknumbers to correspond to rest of the article, data until the end of October, and numbers expressed as per 100.000 population. Could you let me know whether this was indeed the type of epicurve you were looking for?


