The National Public Health Emergency Team (NPHE), chaired by the Chief Medical Officer, makes a determination on what level is appropriate for each county in Ireland or for the whole country. I am on that committee with some other PH colleagues. The decisions re phase of restrictions, and to what areas/regions they should apply, are based on the most up to date epi data along with modelling data. The NPHE make a recommendation to government on what level of restriction should be in place; government can choose whether to accept it or not. For example, this week NPHE advised that all Ireland move to Level 5 restrictions, however Government did not accept this and, instead, have put Ireland on level 3 restrictions - <https://www.gov.ie/en/campaigns/resilience-recovery-2020-2021-plan-for-living-with-covid-19/>

Coronavirus COVID-19 Public Health Advice

If you have fever and/or cough you should stay at home regardless of your travel or contact history.

How to Prevent

- Wash** your hands well and often to avoid contamination

- Avoid** touching eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands
- Clean** and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
- Stop** shaking hands or hugging when saying hello or greeting other people
- Distance** yourself at least 2 metres (6 feet) away from other people, especially those who might be unwell

All people are advised to:

- > **Reduce** social interactions
- > **Keep a distance** of 2m between you and other people
- > **Do not** shake hands or make close contact where possible

Thank you for your mail.

I like the clear outline of measures per level, and would very much like to learn what and who decides on the level the country or county is in. I could not find this on the web. Could you share information on this with us?

Our government has put into place national measures since September 29

(<https://www.government.nl/latest/news/2020/09/28/additional-measures-to-combat-the-spread-of-coronavirus>) replacing less restrictive regional measures in high-incidence areas that had already been put into place from Sept 20th; these measures being additional to basic rules such as 1.5m distance, hygiene, self-isolation, etc. (<https://www.government.nl/topics/coronavirus-covid-19/tackling-new-coronavirus-in-the-netherlands/basic-rules-for-everyone>).

Since October 2nd, parliament strongly advises to use face masks in indoor public spaces (in addition to use in public transport, where this already was mandatory): <https://www.government.nl/latest/news/2020/10/02/wearing-of-face-masks-strongly-advised>

The national outbreak management team advised to consider a curfew and facilitating quarantine for students living in dormitories as additional measures.
