(1) Opening

 5.1.2e reports that hospitals in NRW currently treat 1 Dutch and 22 Belgian IC patients. 8 patients have already been transferred back to the Netherlands (2) and Belgium (6). In addition, 4 patients from France (Hauts-de-France) are also in IC treatment in NRW hospitals.

- BE 5.1.2e and NL 5.1.2e express their gratitude to NRW and RP for the incorporation of an exception for inland water transport in the newly issued regulation (CoronaEinreiseVerordnung). NRW 5.1.2e acknowledges with thanks the clarifications by NL in the letter by Minister Hugo de Jonge on the quarantine rules applicable to cross-border workers, distinguishing between cross-border workers and students versus seasonal and migrant workers.
- BE 5.1.2e reports on concerns in Belgium about the situation of health care workers. In a recent survey, 7 out of 10 hospitals stated that more help is needed. Belgium is also aware of Belgian citizens' travelling to the Dutch province of Zeeland. Concerning the effectiveness of measures, she will send a list of current research studies on that topic to be attached to the minutes.
- NL 5.1.2e mentions that it is to be expected that the sale and use of fireworks will be prohibited in the Netherlands for New Year's Eve so that any additional work in hospitals due to injuries caused by fireworks is avoided. Such a decision may cause negative effects on the borders.
- NRW 5.1.2e informs NRW has decided to start Christmas vacation in the schools earlier than planned – last day of school will be Friday, 18th December. The rationale behind the decision is to allow for self-isolation of families who plan to visit older relatives for Christmas.
