

I hope this email finds you well.

ECDC is working on an urgent request from the European Commission about COVID-19 self-collected at-home tests.

We understand that at-home tests are being used in the Netherlands and we would be interested in hearing about how these tests/results are incorporated into your surveillance and control measures.

Specifically we are interested in knowing:

- Is there a process for individuals to report positive at-home test results to public health authorities? If so, what is this process - how do individuals report and to whom?
- Are the positive results counted in your surveillance as confirmed cases?
- Are you able to collect information about the number of at-home tests conducted (or distributed/sold) and/or the number of negative test results? (for testing denominator)
- Do positive at-home test results get followed up by public health authorities in the same way as, for example, a positive laboratory PCR test?
- · Are at-home tests recommended in particular settings or situations? (e.g. occupational settings, prior to appointments/social encounters etc).

We would be grateful if you have any information (no matter how limited) or documents that you could share with us before 5pm on Friday 5th March (or sooner if possible). I apologise for the very short timeframe.
