Dear [5.1.2e]

I just had an interesting call from [5.1.2e] from LCPS:

- 1) They are also planning to send thank-you-letters via post to all the hospitals that have been involved. Their plan is to send out thank-you-letters in the name of LCPS together with wooden-shoes as a keyring. These letters are ready and the intention was to send them out tomorrow. They can provide us with all the e-mail-addresses we asked for, **but the question is also if we maybe want to combine the actions?** What do you think about this? I told [5.1.2e] that I will get back to him with an answer on this question tomorrow before lunch. They will not send out any letters until then. I like the idea to combine it, but am not sure on the exact role LCPS is playing, do we want the ministry to be attached to their actions this closely?
- 2) He will check the numbers of total patients and get back to me on that.
- 3) He needs some help with the cost coverage for one patient: The first 20 or 21 patients were brought to Germany with the help of someone called "[5.1.2e]" who seems to be running a business specialised in patient transportation (not sure if in Germany or the Netherlands) [5.1.2e] said that [5.1.2e] made a vooruitbetaling for the costs, but was not sure about the exact circumstances. There are no problems in the cases where the Dutch health insurance is involved, but in one case the patient is German and has a German health insurance, so [5.1.2e] is now asking the LCPS on who to contact in Germany. I asked [5.1.2e] for more information on this case that he will forward to me (no personal data, of course).

My idea is that we should try to find a contact person to reach out to in Germany as we agree with [5.1.2e] that we surely want to avoid that the patient finds a cost-letter in his post box when returning home. Not sure though if the patient lives in the Netherlands or in Germany though. On the other side we do not want to be solving a single case of course as a ministry... Let's talk about this when I have more information. My idea is that I could reach out to the German Ministry of Health to find a contact person?
